COMMUNICATIONS TO THE BOARD

Mr. Curtin shared with the Board a letter he received from Christina Livers, Russell Township Trustee, thanking Geauga Park District for allowing them to host the Russell Community Day at The West Woods park. Their goal was to draw together diverse groups and organizations in Russell Township to celebrate the State of Ohio's Bicentennial. Ms. Livers shared that over 600 people were in attendance.

Mr. McCullough shared an e-mail he received from Mr. and Mrs. Ben Fisco. Mr. Fisco stated that his family got over to the bike trail and rode the six-mile section that is open. He expressed how beautiful the bike trail was and that he and his family is anxious for the remainder of the trail to open.

Mr. McCullough received a letter from Pat Leech. Mrs. Leech thanked the Board for the opportunity to have served on the Geauga Park District Foundation Board. She expressed her appreciation of being associated with the Park Commissioners and staff and loves the Park system.

Dr. Rzeszotarski shared with the Board comments made to him at the Volunteer Gathering brunch on Saturday, October 11, 2003. Volunteers expressed the need to heat the bathrooms at The Rookery. Mr. Curtin responded that the heating of the bathrooms could be accomplished and would be included in next year's project list.

Mr. McCullough shared with the Board a copy of a photograph he received from Paul Newman depicting the fall foliage surrounding the entrance of the Donald W. Meyer Center.

Mr. Curtin shared communication concerning the acceptance of the donated telescope. Mr. Curtin and Mr. McCullough plan to go to North Royalton where the telescope is housed and make arrangements for the telescope to be transported to the McGrath property for renovation.

DONALD W. MEYER CENTER RENOVATIONS

Mr. Curtin shared with the Board that the Park has received bid proposals for the renovations of the Cherry Room acoustics, carpeting, and painting at the Donald W. Meyer Center. Mr. Curtin shared with the Board that \$35,400.00 had been budgeted for this project. Bids were received as follows:

It was Mr. Curtin's recommendation to the Board to approve the following: Frank's Floor & Carpet for the Cherry Room acoustic wall carpet, Homestead Interiors, Inc. for the floor carpeting in the public areas, and Capitol Painting, Inc. for the painting of the walls in the Donald W. Meyer Center.

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Mr. Curtin added that Jerry Holzheimer, Project Manager, was currently in discussion with Frank's Floor & Carpet to determine the exact installation criteria in anticipation of a price adjustment to his base bid. Mr. Curtin's recommendation to approve Frank's Floor & Carpet is based on a figure that would keep this project within the budget.

An adjustment would also be made to Capitol Painting, Inc.'s contract reducing the base bid by deleting selected itemized prices, such as wood touch up, varnishing and woodwork washing the Cherry Room.

Mr. McCullough moved to accept the Executive Director's recommendation as stated above and the prices as received based on all the elements not exceeding the budgeted amount of Thirty-Five Thousand Four Hundred Dollars (\$35,400.00) for the renovation of the Donald W. Meyer Center Miss Cope seconded the motion and the roll being called upon its adoption, the vote resulted as follows:

FELKIN HOUSE

Minutes of

Tom Curtin updated the Board on the auction of the Felkin house contents, which the Board previously approved as surplus property at the July 8, 2003, Board meeting. Advertisement, open houses, and procedure for the auction were conducted in accordance with Ohio Revised Code Section 1545.12 guidelines. Packets were distributed to eleven entities. One bid was received. Mr. Curtin asked the Board to approve the bid for the contents of the Felkin house on an "as is" basis to Rodney Ziegler for the amount of Five Hundred Twenty-Six Dollars (\$526.00). Mr. Ziegler would have until October 29th to remove the contents.

Dr. Rzeszotarski moved to accept the bid for the contents of the Felkin house as stated above to Rodney Zeigler for the amount of Five Hundred Twenty-Six Dollars (\$526.00).

Dr. Rzeszotarski inquired about the time-line for the demolition of the house pursuant to the terms of the Agreement with Mr. and Mrs. Felkin. Mr. McClintock responded that once the contents of the house have been removed, the Park would proceed with demolition. It is anticipated that the demolition would take place in November. Dr. Rzeszotarski further inquired whether we had any interest in a controlled burn. Mr. Curtin responded that because of the trees that surround the house, the Park would not be conducting a controlled burn.

THE WEST WOODS UPDATE

Geothermal System

Tom Curtin reported to the Board that there has been a resolution of the geothermal heating issue. The field water temperatures have been monitored throughout the summer and into early fall. We will need to add the ethanol to the system. This would lower the viscosity, which is better on the pumps, and ethanol is environmentally approved. The temperatures never reached as high as we would have liked, but they are falling to levels that indicate the definitive need to add ethanol. We need to move quickly on this.

Roof Leaks

J. G. Johnson Construction Company will be coming out to look at the roof leaks. They will concentrate on the flashing at the employee entrance and lobby. J. G. Johnson Construction Company believes that the changes we made to the cupola should relieve the freezing problem. Materials around the cupola were removed to create better air circulation in the attic space.

SILVER CREEK RESTORATION

Keith McClintock, Deputy Director, reported that the permits from the Ohio Environmental Protection Agency and the U. S. Army Corp of Engineers have been approved. The plans were reviewed and found to be in compliance. Mr. McClintock reported that we would commence surveying work next week with construction beginning in early November. Mr. McClintock will keep the Board updated.

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CITY OF BRUNSWICK

Mr. McClintock also reported that we received a request from the City of Brunswick requesting that we accept 500 feet of mitigation for a project they are working on at Brunswick Lake to be applied to the Silver Creek restoration project. Mr. McClintock recommended that Geauga Park District accept this mitigation in the amount of Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00).

Miss Cope moved to accept the mitigation from the City of Brunswick in the amount of Seventy-Five Thousand Dollars (\$75,000.00) as stated above.

PARK UPDATES

Tom Curtin reported the following:

Affelder - Architects are in the process of reworking the project cost estimates.

Bass Lake Preserve — A plan to repair the truss at the clubhouse is being prepared. A Rom-Tec restroom will be placed adjacent to the clubhouse connected by a breezeway and will be heated with electric heat. Dr. Rzeszotarski questioned the time frame for work to begin. Mr. Curtin responded the beginning of 2004.

<u>Big Creek Addition and Ranger Garage</u> — The punch list items for this project are being addressed. Jerry Holzheimer, Project Manager, will be meeting with the architect and contractor to close out the project.

<u>The Maple Highlands Trail – Central</u> — The Level 1 Ecological Survey requested by the Ohio Department of Transportation has been performed. The project should be bid out by the end of the year.

The Maple Highlands Trail – Chardon Connector — We are working with Foresight Engineering to map out the required easement behind Pentair Corporation. We are preparing a typical purchase agreement for Pentair Corporation's consideration.

<u>The Maple Highlands Trail – North</u> — We are making minor repairs to the bike trail (sealing cracks). We should have the test results on the properties of the fill material from the engineering firm by the end of the week.

<u>The Maple Highlands Trail – Parking Area</u> — Project plans have been resubmitted for the Ohio Department of Transportation's sale of the project this fall.

<u>Donald W. Meyer Center</u> — We have requested a larger piece of the acoustic fabric to be used in the Cherry Room. This will allow us to match the paint color. The replacement carpeting will be the same as what we used in the new addition of the building.

<u>Walter C. Best Wildlife Preserve</u> — Repairs to the Best Preserve have been completed, and the park is open. The water is high due to beaver activity at the outlet. We will work on remedying the situation.

<u>Miscellaneous</u> — The Phase I Environmental Site Assessments for Hambden Investments, Inc. has been completed. Environmental Site Assessments for the Gent Machine Company and the Edwards- Smith properties are underway.

EMPLOYEE HEALTHINSURANCE

Keith McClintock and Robin Pilarczyk, Human Resource Manager, have been attending health insurance subcommittee meetings with Geauga County governmental agencies. Two bids were received: Aetna Life Insurance Company (hereinafter referred to "Aetna") and QualChoice. Aetna presented an aggressive proposal giving employees the option of using University Hospitals and Cleveland Clinic. The Board of Geauga County Commissioners approved a contract with Aetna based on the recommendation from the subcommittee.

Dr. Rzeszotarski moved to approve a health insurance coverage plan with Aetna. The health insurance co-pay schedule based on the Geauga Park District Board's budgeting and as recommended by the Geauga County Commissioners is as follows:
