REVIEW OF MISSION STATEMENT AND PARK PHILOSOPHY

The Board reviewed the current Geauga Park District Mission Statement and Park Philosophy.

MISSION STATEMENT

The mission of Geauga Park District is to preserve, conserve and protect the natural features of Geauga County and to provide the opportunity for people to enjoy and appreciate these resources.

PHILOSOPHY

Geauga Park District was created for the purpose of conserving natural resources. The parks are usually large undeveloped tracks of land devoted to conserving and preserving the forests, grasslands, wetlands, geological features, rivers, streams, lakes and ponds, and the plants and animals associated therewith. Prime consideration is given to protecting the natural aesthetic values and scenic landscapes. Only a small percentage of the area is physically developed, and then only when this is not in conflict with the objectives of protection and conservation.

Development in the parks provides the opportunity to use and enjoy the natural resources without diminishing their quality for future visitors. Recreation is primarily limited to passive trail-oriented activities. Most developments should provide an opportunity to learn more about the parks, the plant and animal life and other natural features.

Programs are offered to increase the public's knowledge of the natural and cultural heritage of Geauga County. Programs may be presented anywhere in the county, but will usually be scheduled in the parks.

Geauga Park District strives to maintain clean, safe parks which are enjoyable to visit and which protect valuable natural resources for the benefit of present and future generations. We believe that we are, and we intend to remain, "the best Park District in Ohio".

PARK UPDATES

Sunnybrook Preserve, Light Pollution Study

Mr. Curtin distributed a copy of the light pollution study done for Sunnybrook Preserve. The Board commented that the study is useful and could be used at the Town Hall Meetings.

Headwaters Park

Handicapped parking and parking lot - will advertise beginning January 29, bid opening on February 19.

Asphalt Work (various sites)

Will advertise beginning February 12, bid opening scheduled for March 4.

Hyde Dam

Landscape Plans for Donald Meyer Center and The West Woods

Sunnybrook Preserve

Will advertise beginning February 12, bid opening scheduled for March 4.

Transmission Lines

The Park has received the environmental review from First Energy for the transmission lines. The Natural Resources Department looked at the preferred route and the alternative route and has concerns about the fragmentation of habitats and also the possibility of invasive species in the proposed area.

The Park has thirty days to respond to the report. A draft of the letter will be sent to the Board for their review prior to submitting it to the Ohio Power Siting Board.

River Oaks Development

River Oaks Development is seeking an at-grade crossing at Maple Highlands Trail Central to build houses on the north side of the railroad right-of-way and is suing to get access. The City of Chardon has also been named in the lawsuit. David Ondrey, Park legal counsel, has submitted a request for summary judgment. Mr. Curtin will be attending a deposition scheduled for February 1, 2008.

2008 Contract Submission List (Revised)

The Board reviewed the Revised 2008 Contract Submission list. Changes were made to the newsletter printing and mailing services.

Dix and Eaton Crisis Management Plan

The Board was given the final version of the Dix and Eaton Crisis Management Plan for their review. Training for staff will be held at an All-Staff meeting. Volunteers will be trained at another time.

Triad Research Group

The Board discussed the survey proposal from Triad Research Group. A decision on the proposal was deferred as the Board would like further information regarding the survey questions and data collection process which will be used by Triad.

Frohring Meadows

Seeding has been placed on hold due to weather conditions. Seeding will take place as soon as weather permits.

GEAUGA PARK DISTRICT FOUNDATION REPORT

Leslie Bednar, Development Officer, expressed her appreciation to the Foundation Board and its committees for their hard work and enthusiasm. The next meeting is scheduled for January 24, 2008 at 5:00 p.m.

CONTRACT REVIEW
